

Minutes of the District Development Committee (DDC) meeting for the month of June, 2026.

The meeting was presided over by Sri. Dibakar Nath, IAS, District Commissioner, Dhubri.
The Chair welcomed all the present members in the meeting and started department wise discussions.

At the outset of the discussions, the District Development Commissioner (DDC) apprised the House about the **Vibrant Village Programme**. He informed that a total of **20 villages** have been identified under the programme, which aims to promote the holistic development of the identified border villages.

The DDC further informed that the District Administration had already submitted the proposals under the programme. However, the proposals were returned due to certain deficiencies and inadequate information furnished in the scheme documents.

Accordingly, the DDC requested all the concerned departments associated with the programme to extend necessary cooperation in rectifying the deficiencies and providing the requisite information at the earliest, so that the revised proposals may be resubmitted to the competent authority for approval.

The Executive Engineer (EE) informed the House that the Fulkatari Bridge Project has remained stalled due to unresolved land-related issues. The EE further apprised that a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) has also been filed in connection with the project, which has further affected its progress.

(R) Dhubri Division		➤ The Chair reviewed the progress of various schemes being implemented by the department, including PMGSY 3.0, SOPD, APART, MMPPPNA, and MMNPPPNA, among others. ➤ The Executive Engineer (EE) informed the House that the progress of several works had been delayed due to the non-availability of forest produce/materials required for execution. The EE further apprised that the work on the Silaikachari Higher Secondary School to Sajuarkuti Par Ghat Road could not be completed owing to unresolved land-related issues. ➤ The District Development Commissioner (DDC) instructed the Executive Engineer (EE) to submit a detailed report to the District Administration regarding the scarcity of forest materials affecting the execution of the works, so that appropriate action may be initiated by the District Administration for early resolution of the issue. (B) Dhubri Division		➤ The Chair reviewed the progress of various ongoing infrastructure projects being implemented by the department, including Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV), NCC Building, Government Law College, RIDF works, and Model Residential School, among others. ➤ The Executive Engineer (EE) informed the House that, despite the requisite payment having been made for the installation of transformers, the Assam Power Distribution Company Limited (APDCL) has not yet installed the transformers at Agomani Higher Secondary School (under NESIDS) and New Model Degree College, Majeralga Part-I & Part-II (under RUSA), which has adversely affected the completion of the respective projects. ➤ Regarding the handing over of Bilasipara Law College, the EE apprised the House that the department has already submitted a communication to the competent higher authority requesting necessary action in the matter. 11	Infrastructure	P.W.D. (NH) Division		➤ The Chair reviewed the progress of the Gauripur Bypass Project. The concerned officer informed the House that the project has been kept under foreclosure due to a substantial escalation in the project cost arising from the revision of the High Flood Level (HFL). The officer further apprised that the revised estimate has been prepared; however, the work is yet to be retendered for execution.	
12	Infrastructure	WATER RESOURCE		➤ The Chair reviewed the progress of the ongoing anti-erosion, bank protection, and pro-siltation works being implemented by the department. The Chair also reviewed the preparedness of the department for flood management, with particular emphasis on the availability and stock position of geo-bags, cement bags, and other flood-fighting materials required for undertaking emergency flood protection measures. During the review, the District Fishery Development Officer (DFDO) informed the House that, under the ADB-SWIFT Project, a total of 6 Beels covering a water spread area of 64.05 hectares had been proposed. Of these, the tendering process has been completed for 5 Beels, while the proposal for the remaining Nalbari Beel, covering a water spread area of 13.25 hectares, could not be processed due to the non-demarcation of the beel area. ➤ The Chair instructed DFDO to submit the complete details of the project in excel format. The DVO further apprised that, under the Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) and Animal Birth Control (ABC) Programme, the district had been assigned a target of 5,000 beneficiaries, against which 3,869 had been covered, achieving 77.38% of the prescribed target. ➤ The DVO requested the competent authority to provide suitable land/space for the establishment of an Animal Birth Control (ABC) Centre to facilitate the safe and systematic sterilization of stray dogs under the programme. ➤ Further, the DVO urged the concerned departments to extend necessary cooperation in promoting fodder cultivation for cattle to ensure the availability of fodder during the flood season. ➤ In this connection, the Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Zilla Parishad, advised that fodder cultivation may be taken up under the Viksit Bharat Gram (VB-G RAM) Scheme, wherever feasible, in accordance with the scheme guidelines. ➤ The DDC instructed DVO to write a letter to the concerned authority regarding the matter of fodder cultivation	DVO
